### **This week in school**

This project is funded through the British Council and it helps both schools develop their curriculum. For example we use Tanzania as an area to study in our geography curriculum. Over the years we have taken out some money that we have raised in our school to help our partner school. The money has always gone directly to the school and even small amounts have made a big impact on the Tanzanian school. This year we are going to do our **Water Bottles Project** where we talk to the children about the need for clean water etc. and then give each class a water bottle to fill with loose change.
